GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

I. <u>GENERAL</u>

- 1) Bidder should take into account any corrigendum published on the tender document before submitting their bids.
- 2) Please go through the tender advertisement and the tender document carefully to understand the documents required to be submitted as part of the bid. Please note the number of covers in which the bid documents have to be submitted, the number of documents including the names and content of each of the document that need to be submitted. Any deviations from these may lead to rejection of the bid.
- 3) Bidder, in advance, should get ready the bid documents to be submitted as indicated in the tender document / schedule and generally, they can be in PDF / XLS / RAR / DWF/JPG formats. Bid documents may be scanned with 100 dpi with black and white option which helps in reducing size of the scanned document.

II. PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS

- 1) The tender bids duly filled in all aspects and uploaded at CPP Portal on or before the scheduled time and date as mentioned in the tender enquiry will be considered for evaluation.
- 2) Bidder should log into the site well in advance for bid submission so that they can upload the bid in time i.e., on or before the bid submission time. Bidder will be responsible for any delay due to other issues.
- 3) The Bids shall be prepared in two parts viz. PQ cum Technical Bid (Part-I) and Price Bid (Part-II). The bidder has to digitally sign and upload the required bid documents one by one as indicated in the tender document.
- 4) Technical Bid will be opened at the first instance and evaluated by IREL's concerned authority. In the second stage, financial bids of only the technically eligible offers will be opened for further evaluation and ranking before awarding the contract.

PQ cum Techno-commercial bid (Part -I)

It contains documents in support of eligibility criteria, self-attested tender document and any other document specifically specified in this tender document.

Part -II shall contain Price Bid (to be submitted electronically).

This part shall contain only Schedule of prices duly filled in as per the Bid Proposal Schedules. No physical submission of hard copy is permitted.

5) The uploaded tender documents become readable only after the tender opening by the authorized bid openers.

III. METHOD OF SELECTION:

Part-I of the bid will be evaluated and bidders meeting the PQ criteria and other tender conditions will be qualified as eligible bidders for opening of the price bids. The price bids opened subsequently will be scrutinized for responsiveness and IREL shall consider placement of order on the qualified bidder, whose offer shall be overall lowest. However, IREL reserves the right to accept or reject all or any tender without assigning any reasons and does not bind itself to accept the lowest offer.

Note: To assist in the examination of documents submitted by the bidder in support of eligibility criteria (PQ), IREL may, at its discretion, ask the Bidder for clarification of its bid. The request for clarification and the response shall be in writing and no change in the price or substance of the bid shall be sought, offered or permitted.

IV. SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1.0 SITE VISIT:

Prior to quoting rates, the bidders are advised to visit the site on any working days at our specified visiting hours with the permission of Engineer concerned /Purchase Dept. The bidders are also advised to study the labour supply/availability, trade union practices and labour rates prevailing at Udyogamandal.

2.0 EFFECT AND VALIDITY OF BID:

- (i) The submission of any bid connected with these documents and specifications shall constitute an agreement that the bidder shall have no cause of action or claim against IREL for rejection of his bid.
- (ii) The bid shall be valid for a period of 90 days from bid due date.

3.0 RIGHT TO REJECT THE TENDER:

- 3.1 IREL reserves the right to reject any tenders whatsoever without assigning any reason thereof.
- 3.2 IREL reserves the right to modify/ add/ reduce the scope, either in whole or in part any of the clauses mentioned herein without assigning any reason thereof.
- 3.3 Further IREL, in its sole discretion and without incurring any obligation or liability, reserves the right, at any time, to;
- a. suspend and/ or cancel the Bidding Process and/ or amend and/ or supplement the Bidding Process or modify the dates or other terms and conditions relating thereto;
- b. consult with any Bidder in order to receive clarification or further information;
- c. pre-qualify or not to pre-qualify any Bidder and/ or to consult with any Bidder in order to receive clarification or further information;
- d. retain any information and/ or evidence submitted to IREL by, on behalf of, and/ or in relation to any Bidder; and/ or
- e. independently verify, disqualify, reject and/ or accept any and all submissions or other information and/ or evidence submitted by or on behalf of any Bidder

It shall be deemed that by submitting the Bid, the Bidder agrees and releases IREL, its employees, agents and advisers, irrevocably, unconditionally, fully and finally from any and all liability for claims, losses, damages, costs, expenses or liabilities in any way related to or arising from the exercise of any rights and/ or performance of any obligations hereunder and the Bidding Documents, pursuant hereto, and/ or in connection with the Bidding Process, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law, and waives any and all rights and/ or claims it may have in this respect, whether actual or contingent, whether present or in future.

4.0. **PRICES**:

Tenders offering firm prices are only acceptable to us. Firm Price shall be quoted as per the price schedule for delivery at designated works. GST as applicable is to be considered as per the Price Schedule of the tender document.

5.0 TENDER RATES:

- a) The rates quoted in the price schedule shall be in Indian rupees only. The quoted rates shall be firm throughout the period of Contract including extension of time, if any.
- b) If the bidder submits abnormally low bid in combination with other elements of the bid which raises material concern as to the capability of the bidder to perform the contract at the offered price, the bidder shall be asked to provide detailed price analysis of the bid in relation to the scope, schedule allocation of risk and responsibilities and any other requirements of the bid documents. If the bidder fails to demonstrate its capability to deliver the contract at the offered price the price bid shall be considered un-responsive.
- c) Organization is the final authority to judge the tender called items and has every power to accept or reject the same without assigning any reasons.

6.0 GUIDELINES FOR PROCUREMENT FROM MSEs

adhered to.

- 1. Procurement from Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSEs):
 The Procurement Policy for Micro and Small Enterprises, 2012 [as amended time to time] has been notified by the Government in exercise of the powers conferred in Section 11 of the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development (MSMED) Act, 2006. In line with Government Policy, the prevailing guidelines in this regard as issued from time to time is to be strictly
- 2. As per the Government notified Public Procurement Policy for Micro & Small Enterprises (MSE), it is mandated that 25% of procurement of annual requirement of goods and services will be sourced from the Micro and Small Enterprises.
- 3. In tender, participating Micro and Small Enterprises (MSE) quoting price within price band of L1+15 (fifteen) per cent shall also be allowed to supply a portion of requirement by bringing down their price to L1 price in a situation where L1 price is from someone other than a MSE and such MSE shall be allowed to supply up to 25(twenty-five) per cent of total tendered value. The 25(twenty five) per cent quantity is to be distributed proportionately among these bidders, in case there are more than one MSEs within such price band.
- 4. Within this 25% (Twenty Five Percent) quantity, a purchase preference of four (4) per cent s reserved for MSEs owned by Scheduled Caste (SC)/ Scheduled Tribe (ST) entrepreneurs and three (3) percent is reserved for MSEs owned by women entrepreneur (if they participate in the tender process and match the L1 price). However, in event of failure of such MSEs to participate in tender process or meet tender requirements and L1 price, four percent sub-target for procurement earmarked for MSEs owned by SC/ST entrepreneurs and three (3) percent earmarked to women entrepreneur will be met from other MSEs.
- 5. MSEs would be treated as owned by SC/ST entrepreneurs:
- a) In case of proprietary MSE, proprietor(s) shall be SC /ST;
- b) In case of partnership MSE, the SC/ ST partners shall be holding at least 51% (fifty-one percent) shares in the unit;
- c) In case of Private Limited Companies, at least 51% (fifty-one percent) share shall be held by SC/ST promoters.
 - If subcontract is given to MSEs, it will be considered as procurement from MSEs.
- 7. In case of tender item cannot be split or divided, etc. the MSE quoting a price within the band L1+15% may be awarded for full/ complete supply of total tendered value to MSE, considering the spirit of the Policy for enhancing Govt. Procurement from MSEs.
- 8. Where any Aggregator has been appointed by the Ministry of MSME, themselves quote on behalf of some MSE units, such offers will be considered as offers from MSE units and all such facilities would be extended to these also.
- 9. Traders/ distributors/ sole agent/ Works Contract are excluded from the purview of the policy.
- 10. To reduce transaction cost of doing business, Micro and Small Enterprises is to be facilitated by providing them tender sets free of cost, exempting Micro and Small Enterprises from payment of Earnest Money (EMD), adopting e-procurement to bring in transparency in tendering process. However, exemption from paying Performance Security / Performance Bank Guarantee is not covered under the Public Procurement policy.
- 11. MSEs may also be given relaxation in prior turnover and prior experience criteria during the tender process, subject to meeting of quality and technical specifications. However, there may be circumstances (like procurement of items related to public safety, health, critical security operations and equipment, etc.) where the vendor having prior experience may be preferred rather than giving orders to new entities.
- 12. Payment to the MSME vendors is to be made within 30 days from the date of receipt and acceptance of goods/ services.
- 13. In case Bidder is a Micro or Small Enterprise under the Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises Development Act, 2006, the Bidder is to be asked for submitting the following along with tender: Ministry of MSME has notified criteria for classifying the enterprises as Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises as combination of investment in Plant & machinery or Equipment and Turnover. Mandatory registration in Udyam Registration Portal for all new and existing MSME has been prescribed. To enhance MSME competitiveness, the Government of India envisioned the Zero Defect Zero Effect (ZED) initiative to make MSME sustainable and transform them as National and International Champions. MSME Sustainable (ZED) Certification is an extensive drive to create awareness amongst MSMEs about Zero Defect Zero Effect (ZED) practices and motivate & incentivise them for ZED Certification while also encouraging them to become

MSME Champions. The ZED (Zero Defect Zero Effect) Certification, a scheme by the Indian government for Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs), offers numerous benefits, including financial incentives, improved quality and productivity, enhanced market access, and increased global competitiveness. 8.0 RESTRICTION ON PROCUREMENT FROM A BIDDER OF A COUNTRY WHICH SHARES A LAND BORDER WITH INDIA (AS PER GOI GUIDELINES AMENDED FROM TIME TO TIME)

The bidder to provide needful certificate.

9.0 IREL reserves the right to increase or decrease the quantity to be ordered up to 25 percent of bid quantity at the time of placement of contract. IREL also reserves the right to increase the ordered quantity by up to 25% of the contracted quantity during the currency of the contract at contracted rates. Bidders are bound to accept the orders accordingly.

10.0 EARNEST MONEY DEPOSIT (EMD)/ BID SECURITY

- 10.1 Earnest Money Deposit (EMD) is a deposit received from the tenderers in token of their earnestness in submitting their offer to undertake the supplies/works/services/consultancy contracts and conclude a contract if entrusted to them on the basis of their tender. The offers received from tenderers without EMD and/or tender cost shall be summarily rejected except where an exemption is provided in the tender.
- 10.2 EMD is to be remitted by way of 'Insurance Surety Bonds' or 'account payee demand draft' or' fixed deposit receipt' or 'bankers cheque' or 'Bank Guarantee from any scheduled commercial Banks' or "online payment' in favour of IREL. The payment details to be informed to Purchase Department well in advance enabling verification of receipt of the amount.
- 10.3 Government Body/Public Sector Undertakings may be exempted from payment of EMD with the approval of Competent Authority.
- 10.4 EMD amount in rupee value is to be mentioned as a fixed amount in the tender and not as a percentage of the estimated cost and no interest is payable on the EMD.
- 10.5 EMD shall be exempted to MSEs and Start-ups as per prevailing guidelines in this regard. Policy is meant for procurement of only goods produced and services rendered by MSEs. However, traders/ distributors/ sole agent/ Works Contract are excluded from the purview of Public Procurement Policy for MSEs Order, 2012.
- 10.6 EMD is liable to be forfeited if:
- a. The tenderer changes the terms and conditions or prices or withdraw his quotation subsequent to the date of opening/ The tenderer impairs or derogates from the tender in any respect within the period of validity of the tender
- b. The tenderer fails to accept the order when placed or fails to commence supplies/works/services after accepting the order.
- c. In case bidder submits false/fabricated documents. d) In case bidder fails to submit SD as stipulated in the tender.
- 10.7 EMD may be adjusted against security deposit / performance security of the successful bidder. EMD of the unsuccessful bidders should be returned to them at the earliest after expiry of the final bid validity period and latest by the 30th day after the award of the contract. Bid security should be refunded to the successful bidder on receipt of performance security. However, in case of two stage bidding/ 2or 3 envelope bidding, EMD of unsuccessful bidders during first stage i.e. technical evaluation etc. should be returned within 30 days of declaration of result of first stage i.e. technical evaluation etc.
- 10.8 In case where the EMD is provided in form of BG in the prescribed format to be attached with the tender, the BG shall be obtained from a scheduled commercial Bank with validity of 45 days beyond final bid validity period.

11.0 <u>SECURITY DEPOSIT (PERFORMANCE SECURITY) OR PERFORMANCE BANK</u> GUARANTEE:

- 11.1 Security deposit (SD) shall be uniformly levied @ 5% of contract value (excluding Taxes) towards satisfactory completion of the order/works as under:
- a) For works contract valued more than Rs.2 lakhs. b) For supply & service contract valued more than Rs.5 lakhs.
 - Performance Security is to be furnished by a specified date (generally 14 (fourteen) days after notification of the award) and it should remain valid for a period of 60 (sixty) days beyond the date of completion of all contractual obligations of the supplier/ contractor, including warranty obligations/ defect liability period (DLP).
 - In exceptional cases waiver of SD shall be approved by Competent Authority after recording the reasons for such waiver.
- 11.2 Submission of SD/PBG, if called for in the tender can also be paid through Insurance Surety Bonds" or "account payee demand draft" or "fixed deposit receipt from a Scheduled Commercial bank" or "Bank Guarantee issued/ confirmed from any Scheduled Commercial Banks in India" or online payment to be confirmed sharing Unique Transaction Reference (UTR) to the tender inviting authority as called for in tender. In case of GTE tenders, the performance security should be in the same currency as the contract and must conform to Uniform Rules for Demand Guarantees (URDG 758) an international convention regulating international securities. In case

of JV, the BG towards performance security shall be provided by all the partners in proportion to their participation in the project. Bank Guarantees towards Bid Security/ Security Deposit/ PBG issued by Nationalized Banks/ Scheduled Commercial Banks (other than Cooperative Banks) only acceptable.

Purchase Department should immediately forward the SD to finance department for necessary action under intimation to EIC/ OIC.

In exceptional cases of work contracts, the approving authority may consider Recovering balance SD (in addition to EMD if it is given not in BG form) amount from 1st running bill of the contractor which shall be specifically mentioned in the tender document itself.

- 11.3 EMD/ Bid Security may be adjusted towards SD. However, if EMD is submitted in the form of Bank Guarantee, fresh Bank Guarantee in the prescribed format or demand draft/ bankers cheque is to be submitted towards SD.
- 11.4 BG format for security deposit is attached in Annexure-XIV.
- 11.5 The SD shall not bear any interest and is liable to be forfeited for unsatisfactory completion or on abandonment of the supply/ work order.
- 11.6 Additional amount of SD due to enhancement in scope of work is also to be batined.

12.0 RETENTION MONEY

- 12.1 Where in a contract, payment is made on progressive billing of work executed, 5% of the bill value shall be retained at the time of making payment towards rectification/defective work made a s retention money.
- 12.2 The total SD and retention money together towards performance guarantee shall not exceed 10% of the contract value.

13.0 REFUND OF SD AND RETENTION MONEY

- a. Before releasing SD or retention money in respect of supplies/works, a "No Due Certificate" shall be issued by EIC/OIC duly countersigned by head of the department after ensuring that no amounts are recoverable from the supplier/contractor.
- b. EIC/OIC shall recommend release of SD and retention money after compliance by the contractor towards guarantee/warranty/performance guarantee & other related clauses as stipulated in the purchase/work order and on submission of formal claim by contractor.
- c. On receipt of "no dues certificate" from EIC/OIC, SD or retention money retained in the form of B.G and / or any form shall be refunded at the earliest, if the contractor is not liable to pay any money to IREL (India) Limited under any other contract.

14.0 FORFEITURE OF SD & RETENTION MONEY

The SD & retention money shall stand forfeited in favor of IREL (India) Limited, without any further notice to the contractor in the following circumstances:

In case of any failure whatsoever on the part of the contractor at any time during performance of his part of the contract including the extended periods of contract, where notice is given and time for rectification allowed.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT (SCOC)

SCOPE OF WORK

The Scope of Work consists of the following activities:

- 1. **PART A:** FRP lining Relining Works.
- 2. **PART B:** Repair & Maintenance of Process Tanks, Mechanical Structures, Painting of Equipment & Mechanical Structures and Dismantling of unused mechanical items.
- 3. **PART C:** Dismantling & Erection of agitators, gear boxes, motors, electric hoists and other equipment.
- 4. **PART D:** Replacement of FRP Handrails and other Miscellaneous Works.

1.0 PART A: FRP LINING/ RELINING WORKS:

1.1 SCOPE OF WORK:

FRP repair and relining of equipment/vessels/ducts/tanks/structures, etc., and arresting tank/equipment leakages by removing/dismantling the existing damaged portions and providing MS sheet/ plate with continuous welding (as stated in Part B of the Scope of Work) followed by FRP relining inside the process tank/equipment. The FRP lining works are to be done as per the details given below.

1.2 EQUIPMENT/ITEMS TO BE REPAIRED/LINED WITH FRP:

- 1. Storage Tanks & Tank Covers. (Lined and Moulded)
- 2. Process Tanks & Tank Covers. (Lined and Moulded)
- 3. Settling Tanks/Mixer Settlers. (Lined and Moulded)
- 4. Blower. (Lined and Moulded)
- 5. Ventilation Ducts. (Moulded)
- 6. Ion exchange columns. (Moulded)
- 7. Fabricated structures of M.S. Angles, M.S. Channels, M.S. Joints, M.S. Pipes, etc.(Lined)
- 8. Agitators, Stirrers & Agitator Bridges over the process tanks. (Lined and Moulded)
- 9. Tray for filter press. (Lined and Moulded)
- 10. Any other equipment other than stated above. (Lined and Moulded)

1.3 TYPES OF WORK:

- 1. One layer of chopped strand mat (450gm/m2) with Bisphenol/ Isophthalic resin.
- 2. One layer of surface mat with Bisphenol/ Isophthalic resin.
- 3. One coat of resin Isophthalic (with pigment).
- 4. Fabrication, replacement/ repairing of tanks/ process vessels with MS sheets/ Plates for reconditioning including FRP lining inside the tank.

1.4 QUANTITY:

Approximate quantity of FRP lining work:

- 1. 150 Sq.mtr (1 layer of chopped matting Isophthalic resin)
- 2. 750 Sq.mtr (1 layer of chopped matting- Bisphenol resin)
- 3. 100 Sq.mtr (1 layer of surface matting Isophthalic resin)
- 4. 225 Sq.mtr (1 layer of surface matting Bisphenol resin)

5. 50 Sq.mtr (1 layer of pigment coating – Isophthalic resin)

IREL will not be responsible for any change in the total estimated area and the contractor is not eligible for any compensation in this regard. The split up quantities are given for approximate assessment of the work. The contract will be bound by the total value. The contractor has to quote as per the "BOQ/price schedule" attached.

1.5 <u>DETAILS AND PROCEDURE FOR FRP LINING WORKS:</u>

- 1. The contractor has to commence the work immediately on receiving work instructions from EIC and complete the same within the stipulated time. The responsible person/supervisor shall be available at call at all times.
- 2. IREL will provide facilities like power, water and air free of cost. FRP Lining materials (resins, mats, etc.) and working implements, scaffoldings, blowers or exhaust fans for ventilation, provision for illumination, etc. must be under contractor's scope of supply. Invoice of the FRP lining materials purchased shall be submitted to the EIC. Inspection of the materials should be done at the entry of the IREL. All the materials required to carry out the work shall be shown to the EIC and after inspection by the EIC, will be brought inside IREL premises.
- 3. Roughly 30% of the total FRP work will be of fabrication type, which include fabrication of FRP channels, cover plates, small cylinders, ducting, piping, etc. and joining of FRP ducting/piping at site. IREL will pay only for the FRP lining work done. Party has to carry out cutting, setting/positioning, removal & refitting of cover plates for tanks, dismantling and refixing of dummy valve, bottom valve and decantation valve, Pipe Racks/ Pipes/ Pipe Supports which are obstructing while carrying out the repair works to carry out FRP lining works, etc. at their own cost. Tank/Equipment after being handed over by the production department shall be water washed by the contractor before starting FRP work. After completion of FRP lining work also, Tank/Equipment should be properly water washed before handing it over to the production department. Work should proceed without any interruption.
- 4. Most of the FRP lining/repair works are done at site, which include working above 3 meter height, working inside tanks etc. While attending work inside tanks, necessary cover plates of tanks have to be removed/dismantled and after completion of work to be put back by the contractor. No additional payment other than charges for lining work done will be given to the contractor. The rate quoted for FRP lining work shall include material, labour, removal of old FRP lining, cleaning the surface and FRP lining work wherever needed. Repairing of ducts shall be carried out at heights. The necessary scaffolding, platform, etc. shall be arranged by the contractor without any extra cost.
- 5. While carrying out lining work, sufficient time is to be given for drying between subsequent layers of applying mat/surface. No filler material shall be used along with the resins while doing FRP lining works.
- 6. No claim for revision of the rates will be entertained under any circumstances during the period of contract. Timely completion has to be ensured for each FRP repair works.
- 7. The equipment/item to be repaired/lined can be inspected at our work spot during working hours and any further clarification, if required, can be obtained by the EIC.
- 8. The FRP lining work must be done after removing old FRP lining from the surface and shall be properly cleaned by using cup brush attached with angle grinder. The contractor must get approval from the Officer concerned of Maintenance section regarding the surface preparation, before commencing the FRP lining work.

1.6 CONTRACTOR'S SCOPE OF SUPPLY:

The contractor has to supply the resins and mats as per the Clause 1.4 and Clause 1.7. The contractor shall bring the required quantity of Resin and Mat as per the specification mentioned and shall supply the same to Maintenance Section, and the same will be issued for working on need basis. Resins and Mat shall only be accepted if it is meeting our specifications.

Working implements, scaffoldings, blowers or exhaust fans for ventilation, provision for illumination, etc. must be under contractor's scope of supply. Inspection of the materials should be done at the entry of the IREL. All the materials required to carry out the work shall be shown to the EIC and after inspection by the EIC will be brought inside IREL premises.

1.7 QUALITY AND TESTING:

- I. The surface matting layer must have a resin content of 80-85% by weight.
- II. The chopped strand mattings must have a resin content of 50-60% by weight.
- III. For testing, the Company may adopt one of the testing methods mentioned below:
- 1. Visual inspection for cracks, blow holes, etc.
- 2. Cut pieces (of approximate size 50mmx50mm) will be taken from the lining and boiled in water/10% H2SO4 / 10% HCl for Isophthalic resin and water /10% NaOH for Bisphenol resin for about 4 hours. No discoloration for the sample is permitted. Also the weight loss of the sample if any, should not exceed 0.5%.
- 3. For determining the glass content, the samples will be heated in a furnace at a temperature of 565°C for four to five hours and allowed to cool in a desiccator. The loss of weight of the sample is taken as the weight of the resin.
- 4. Spark testing at a rate of 4KV / mm thickness need to be done if required.
- 5. The identified area for lining work must be done only after properly cleaning by cup brush attached with Angle Grinder and obtaining EIC in charge approval regarding the surface preparation.

2.0 PART B: REPAIR & MAINTENANCE OF PROCESS TANKS, MECHANICAL STRUCTURES, PAINTING OF EQUIPMENT & MECHANICAL STRUCTURES AND DISMANTLING OF UNUSED MECHANICAL ITEMS:

2.1 SCOPE OF WORK:

- 1. The work includes Repair/Replacement of damaged portion of the equipment, process vessels, furnaces, carbon steel pipe lines, pipe/cable racks, platforms, platform supports, hand rails, steel structural, etc., and painting while the Plant is in operation.
- 2. Painting of the steel structures consisting of the complete equipment, process vessels, furnaces, carbon steel pipe lines, pipe/cable racks, platforms, platform supports, hand rails, steel surfaces, etc.
- 3. Dismantling of damaged/unwanted equipment, pipes, structural, etc., in the Plant and other areas
- 4. Colour coding of HDPE pipes by pasting Adhesive tapes of appropriate colours as per the colour code if required. Colour code is mentioned as per Annexure-IIA.
- 5. Painting the name & number of the tank/equipment in black colour with yellow back ground.

2.2 DETAILS OF THE WORK & PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED WHILE PAINTING:

- 1. The steel surfaces before painting are to be cleaned thoroughly by using cup brush attached with angle grinder, wire brushes, scrapers, emery papers / tapes, chisel, etc. Any damaged portion of tanks, hand rails, structural members of the pipe racks, ladder, platform and its supports, etc. are to be repaired/ replaced. The Contractor shall inform the EIC after completing the surface preparation of the Structures, Process Tanks, MS Pipes, etc. before painting. Tanks which have pitting /dent/localized corroded portion on the outer surface after the surface preparation to be informed to the EIC. Painting should be carried out only after approval of the EIC. Wherever necessary, if instructed by the EIC, Titanium/Metal Putty to be applied before carrying out the primer painting work. Titanium putty for the said work will be supplied by IREL.
- 2. After cleaning, the steel surface has to be painted with one coat of Epoxy chemical resistant primer and two coats of Epoxy chemical resistant finish paint. The painting shall be done by using hand brush only. Before applying the different coats the previously coated surface must be properly wiped/cleaned with cotton waste to remove the moisture and the other condensed vapour present on the steel surface. A minimum of 24 hrs time must be given between the two coats of paint. The colour of the final coat should be as per "pipeline colour codes" given. Wherever appropriate colours are not available in the chemical resistant grade an extra coat of synthetic enamel paint of appropriate colour has to be given over the final coat of the chemical resistant finish paint.
- 3. While undertaking the painting of the cross bridges, cover plates, pipe lines, pipe racks, structures, reduction gears etc. above the Process tanks, Nutsche Filter, etc. care must be taken to ensure that the contents of the vessels are not contaminated with rust and dirt generated by cleaning / surface preparation. Wherever the equipment is contaminated with oil and dirt, the surface has to be cleaned with mineral turpentine before painting. The painting of the structures above process tanks, has to be properly planned by the contractor in advance so that the Plant Incharge can remove the material or solvent inside the tank before handing over the respective tank to carry out cleaning and painting works without contaminating the contents of the tank. Any damage caused to the nearby equipment, pipelines, etc. while painting, has to be repaired free of cost by the contractor.
- 4. The contractor has to dismantle and re-fix the HDPE pipelines/fittings/pipe tray/racks/LDPE tanks/Sintex Tanks/ wooden chequered board to carry out fabrication/repair works on damaged/corroded portion of the equipment/platform structures. The work should be carried out in consultation with Plant Incharge/ EIC so that normal Plant operation remains unaffected. Any obstructions in carrying out the allocated work has to be taken care by the contractor. This work is part of repairing of tanks and platform/ mechanical structures as per S. No. of 7 & 8 of BOQ.
- 5. After cleaning the structure/tanks/equipment, the damaged portion before painting shall be shown to EIC. Painting shall not be carried out on the damaged portion of the MS Structure without repairing/reconditioning of the same.
- 6. After completion of painting work in equipment or tank, the contractor must paint the name and number on the tank in black colour with yellow background. Normal size of the letter should be 150mm and if the equipment or tank height is smaller than 2000mm and 1000 mm in diameter the letter shall be of 100mm. The contractor has to strictly adhere to the colour codes which will be attached along with the work order.
- 7. Many pipelines are laid of HDPE material in the plant. Adhesive tapes of appropriate colours as per colour codes must be wound on these pipes at a distance of 1mtr apart if required.
- 8. Before painting/ FRP lining, the damaged structural members of equipment, process vessels, furnaces, carbon steel pipe lines, pipe/cable racks, platforms, platform supports, hand rails, steel structural, etc., has to be repaired/ replaced. Contractor shall also fabricate and erect MS Structural Supports and Working Platform for equipment. Wherever the HDPE / MS lines are sagging due to insufficient supports, additional supports have to be provided as per the directions of the EIC. Replacement of damaged structures, Structural fabrication and erection work shall be carried out as per the instruction of EIC.

- 9. The equipment/structural identified for painting shall be completed without any delay by the contractor. As the equipment in process plant is in continuous operation, the equipment released for painting by production department shall be handover in time without affecting the production.
- 10. Contractor has to ensure that the different layers of paints are being applied after inspection by EIC. The painting work shall be carried out after obtaining stage wise clearance which includes proper surface preparation, one coat of epoxy chemical resistance primer and two coat of epoxy chemical resistance finish paint. A work register shall be maintained by the contractor for this purpose with location details, date of painting, Description of work, quantity of paint consumed to carry out the work and submit the register to EIC on daily basis.
- 11. Coverage of epoxy primer & epoxy finish paint shall be calculated at 4-5 m²/liter of actual area painted. The contractor shall bring the required quantity of epoxy chemical resistant primer & finish paint as per manufacturer's specification and shall supply/store in the Maintenance section, and the same will be issued for working on need basis. Paint & primer shall only be accepted along with the Test Certificate.
- 12. The work is to be carried out in running plant, the work may be interrupted based on the availability of plant and its equipment. The contractor must be able to work based on the plant availability. The day of such interruptions in the work will not be accounted as delay in completion of the work. Any change in the time of completion must be sought by written request by the contractor well in advance.
- 13. The rate for painting shall include cost of Epoxy Chemical resistant Primer & Finish Paint, labour charges for surface preparation and painting as per mentioned in Clause no. 2.2 (1) and 2.2 (2). No extra charges will be given for providing the colour codes to HDPE pipes (By pasting the tapes on the pipes) and for lettering & numbering of tanks.

2.3 <u>DETAILS OF THE WORK & PROCEDURES TO BE FOLLOWED WHILE REPAIR & MAINTENANCE OF PROCESS TANKS & MECHANICAL STRUCTURES:</u>

- 1. The Contractor has to replace/repair the damaged/corroded parts of the Process Tanks and Platform Structures as per the instructions of EIC. Repair of Platform structures include dismantling and refixing of MS Structures/Wooden Chequered Board/Pipe racks/trays/supports. Measurement will be taken only for the newly fabricated structures replaced against the damaged/corroded portion of the structures.
- 2. To carry out repair of Process Tank, on getting the intimation by EIC, the contractor has to ensure electrical disconnection of the motor, dismantle the top cover plate, bottom dummy, sludge removal and thorough cleaning of the tank with water before starting the repair work.
- 3. In case of repair/ replacement of process tank bridges (structure for mounting pedestal, gear box and motor across the tank) the contractor may have to dismantle the Gear box, motor and connected accessories before repairing/ replacing the bridge, in such cases the measurement shall be taken only for bridge fabrication works as per Sl. No. 7 of the Bill of Quantities. No further payment for gearbox, motor, agitator and pedestal dismantling and fixing shall be considered. After the completion of bridge repair/ replacement the contractor has to refix gearbox, motor, pedestal and agitator by ensuring proper alignment. The Contractor is responsible for smooth operation of the said equipment.
- 4. The damaged Wooden Chequered Board is to be replaced with new board, as per the instruction of EIC. Replacement with new Wooden Chequered Board shall be paid as per Bill of Quantities (BOQ) against per square metre basis. All Wooden Chequered Board required to be replaced shall be under the scope of Contractor. Wooden Chequered Board shall be of minimum 18mm thickness. During repairing of Platform structures, party has to dismantle the existing wooden chequered board (if found in good condition) and refix the same wooden chequered board after completion of the platform repair works, in such cases measurement shall not be considered for chequered board fixing under Sl. No. 9 of the BOQ, measurement under Sl. No. 8 shall only be considered for MS Structure repair/ replacement works. In case the wooden chequered board is in damaged condition party has to replace with new wooden chequered board for which

measurement will be considered under Sl. No. 9 of the BOQ.

- 5. The work also includes cutting and removing of damaged structures/unwanted MS Pipes / cable / pipe racks/ wooden chequered board (inside & outside the plants) that does not requires replacement. After dismantling these pipes, the flanges should be cut and given to the workshop and the unwanted/ unused items should be disposed in the scrap yard. Contractor shall route the dismantled/damaged items through weigh bridge and weighment slip to be produced to EIC. The dismantling of damaged/unwanted MS Tank/ Pipes/ Structures/ other miscellaneous items that does not require replacement shall be routed through the Weighing Bridge and shall be accounted under S.No. 10 of the BOQ. The damaged/corroded items that requires replacement or new fabrication shall not be accounted under Sl.No. 10 of the BOQ and shall directly sent to Scrap Yard without taking weighment.
- 6. The rate for the fabrication/repair charges (under S.No. 7&8 of BOQ) shall include the cost of dismantling of damaged structural which need replacement.

2.4 CONTRACTOR'S SCOPE OF SUPPLY:

The Contractor has to supply Wooden Chequered Board of minimum 18mm thickness, Epoxy Chemical Corrosion resistance primer, finish paints and thinner as per the requirement. The contractor shall bring the required quantity of chemical resistant epoxy primer & finish paint as per the specification and shall supply/store in Maintenance section, and the same will be issued for working on need basis. Paint, Primer & Thinner shall have minimum shelf life of 6 months and only be accepted along with the Test Certificate.

For naming of the tanks/equipment Yellow and Black Enamel paint shall also be brought by the contractor. All tools and accessories required for cleaning, surface preparation and painting of tanks and equipment like cup brush angle grinder, wire brushes, scrapers, emery papers/tapes, chisel, chipping hammer, painting brush, ladders, scaffoldings, supports, exhaust fans (for ventilation), etc. are to be brought by the contractor.

3.0 <u>PART C: DISMANTLING & ERECTION OF AGITATORS, GEAR BOXES, MOTORS, ELECTRIC HOISTS AND OTHER EQUIPMENT</u>

3.1 SCOPE OF WORK:

- **1.** Dismantling of Agitators, Gear boxes, Motors, Electric Hoists and other miscellaneous items from various locations in plant,
- 2. Shifting of equipment to the Workshop/Mechanical maintenance section/Electrical maintenance section, etc. (if required) for repair and refitting as instructed by EIC
- 3. Shifting & installing the repaired equipment at required location.

 Electrical disconnection and re-connection of equipment will be done by IREL.

3.2 <u>DETAILS OF WORK</u>

1. AGITATORS INSTALLED IN PROCESS TANKS OF MINIMUM 10 KL CAPACITY:

The work involves dismantling of damaged agitators from process tanks of minimum 10KL and above capacity, shifting the agitators to workshop/mechanical maintenance section and fitting repaired/new agitator on the tanks. The cover plate of tank, any pipe lines etc. which obstruct the work, has to be removed by the contractor and reinstated after completion of the work.

2. GEAR BOXES INSTALLED IN PROCESS TANKS OF MINIMUM 10 KL CAPACITY

The work involves dismantling of damaged Gear boxes from process tanks of minimum 10KL and above capacity, shifting the Gear boxes to workshop/mechanical maintenance section and fitting repaired/new Gear box back on the tanks. Any pipe lines or other objects which obstruct the work, has to be removed by the contractor and reinstated after completion of the work.

3. <u>ELECTRICAL MOTORS (20HP TO 50HP) AND OTHER EQUIPMENT</u>

The work involves dismantling of damaged motors from process tanks or other locations in plant, shifting the Motor to electrical/ mechanical workshop and fitting repaired/new Motor back in position. In addition to that any other equipment like Nutsche Filter, Settlers, small process tanks/vessels, etc. shall be dismantled and refixed as per the instruction of EIC. Any pipe lines or other objects which obstruct the work has to be removed by the contractor and reinstated after completion of the work.

4. ELECTRIC CHAIN HOIST/WIRE ROPE HOIST-1 TO 2 TONS

- 1. The work involves dismantling of damaged Hoists from various locations in plant, shifting the Hoists to electrical/mechanical workshop and fitting repaired/new Hoists back in position. Any pipe lines or other objects which obstruct the work has to be removed by the contractor and reinstated after completion of the work.
- 2. The scrap generated, if any, in the work has to be shifted to scrap yard on daily basis as works are being done in operating plants. The work has to be carried out between 8 AM 4PM on any working day. If it is not possible to complete the work in stipulated time, permission may be given to work after 4 PM on the discretion of the EIC.
- 3. The work has to be done in such a way that there should be no damage to the equipment, nearby structures, buildings, pipe lines etc. Any damage occurring has to be repaired free of cost by the contractor. Carrying out the work in a safe manner is the sole responsibility of the contractor. The decision of the IREL safety section will be final in this regard. The work has to be done following the safety norms practiced by IREL.
- 5. Required electrical connection and disconnection will be done by IREL Electrical Section.
- 6. The work has to be carried out as instructed by the EIC. The work has to be done on a continuous basis once site is given to contractor. In some cases, if after dismantling, spare is not available, then the contractor has to carry out the refitting work after the spare equipment is made available. The rates quoted by the contractor shall include dismantling and refitting of the equipment. In case if only dismantling or refitting is carried out, only half of the rate quoted will be sanctioned.

3.3 <u>CONTRACTOR'S SCOPE OF SUPPLY:</u>

All tools & tackles including chain blocks, ladders, ropes, scaffolding, etc. required for rigging, dismantling and refixing the above mentioned equipment like agitators, gear boxes, motors, etc.

4.0 PART D: REPLACEMENT OF FRP HANDRAILS AND OTHER MISCELLANEOUS WORKS:

4.1 SCOPE OF WORK:

- 1. Dismantling of corroded MS Handrails and Assembling of FRP Handrails and replacing on MS or Concrete Structures as per the instruction of EIC in various areas of the plant.
- 2. Other Miscellaneous Works includes cleaning/clearing HDPE Slurry Line Block, Shifting of heavy equipment, Tanks, Rigging works, Repair works for Calciner, Centrifuges, CF Gearbox, etc. or as instructed by EIC.

4.2 DETAILS OF WORK:

1. Contractor has to dismantle the old corroded MS Handrails and replace it with the new FRP Handrails as per the instructions of the EIC. All the works related to the fixing of handrails shall be executed within the stipulated time period determined by the EIC, without any delay.

- 2. FRP handrails will be provided by the IREL which is to be installed at site by riveting/bolting as per the instruction of EIC. Any other materials other than the FRP Handrails parts like drilling machine, riveting machine, anchor bolts, rivets, etc. shall be under the scope of contractor. The FRP Handrails shall be installed either on the MS Structure or on the Concrete structure, all the tools and tackles necessary for fixing the handrails shall be brought by the contractor.
- 3. The contractor is required to execute the work of miscellaneous nature as and when the need arises, as per the instruction of EIC. The miscellaneous Works may include clearing HDPE Slurry Line Blockage (by dismantling the pipes and refixing after cleaning/clearing), Shifting of Heavy equipment, Tanks, Rigging works, Repair works for Calciner, Centrifuges, CF Gearbox, Fabrication of Nozzles, Fabrication/replacement of damper for duct, tack/ stitch welding (where no new addition of steel), etc. or as instructed by EIC.
- 4. Damage if any caused to the pipe lines/ tanks/ buildings / nearby structures and equipment while carrying out the work has to be repaired free of charge by the contractor. Any waste material generated during the course of work has to be disposed-off in the location as shown by the EIC on daily basis.

4.3 CONTRACTOR'S SCOPE OF SUPPLY:

All Tools & tackles, SS Anchor Bolts, chain blocks, ladders, ropes, scaffoldings, etc.

5.0 OTHERS TERMS & CONDITIONS:

- 5.1 Contractor shall provide atleast 4 Fabricators/ Welders/ Fitter along with 2 Helpers to assist the Fabricators (to carry out Repairing of MS pipe racks/tray/ supports, Process tanks/ vessels, MS Structures, Platforms, etc.), 2 Painters, 1 FRP workmen, and 1 Supervisor daily on all working days (except Sundays, Strikes, Company Holidays, etc.) to carry out the repairing works in plant. However, IREL reserves the right to increase or decrease the minimum workmen requirement temporarily on any day by giving one day prior intimation to the contractor through email.
- 5.2 The Supervisor engaged under this Contract shall work/supervise only under this Work Order only and he shall not be allowed to work /supervise any other Work order in other locations inside the plant premises in any shift. The Supervisor and the workmen if found working in the areas other than allocated under this contract, shall be sent out of the IREL's premises and penalty for that particular day shall be awarded to the contractor as per the penalty clause H(a).
- 5.3 The Workmen reporting for duty may be asked to assist for other works mentioned in the contract, for example FRP person may be asked to assist the painter and vice versa. Workmen engaged shall have multi-tasking capability to carry out work on need basis.
- 5.4 The contract Supervisor along with all workmen shall report to EIC in Maintenance Section daily at 8:10am for job allocation in various plants for effective utilization of manpower as well as timely completion of the work in time. The supervisor shall coordinate with EIC/ Section Head of Maintenance Section and Plant Incharge/ SIC/ Production Department/ Other Services Department to execute the work in safe manner without affecting the process operation/ requirement.
- Depending on the requirement of the work as per the instruction of EIC, contractor shall have to depute additional workers for any of the works mentioned in PART A, B, C & D. In case of breakdown of equipment, tanks, pipe racks, the contractor has to engage additional manpower other than working in general shift to carry out the breakdown works. In case of breakdown maintenance work on Process vessels/ tanks or any other urgent/ emergency works, as instructed by EIC, the contractor shall depute the workmen from 4:00pm to 8:00pm in addition to normal working hours (i.e. from 8:00am to 4:00pm), to complete the work as per the plant requirement. The workmen who is continuing the process vessel repairing work in B-Shift (i.e. from 8:00am to 4:00pm) shall continue the work in C-Shift from 4:00pm to 8:00pm. The contract supervisor shall coordinate the assigned work.

- 5.6 Contractor has to maintain daily attendance register for the workmen and Supervisor reporting for duty under Painting, FRP Lining, Rigging and Welding. Also, the Contractor should maintain the pool of workmen to be engaged under this contract. As this work being continuous in nature in various plants, the contractor should not change the workmen deputed under this contract frequently/ daily to ensure safety, security and timely completion of work. The same group of workmen are to be engaged to carry out the works.
- 5.7 Contractor has to ensure the availability of the workers mentioned in the clause 5.1 failing which, will attract penalty as per the penalty clause.
- 5.8 Contractor has to maintain the Daily Log Book for the works allocated / executed / pending mentioning location as well as date of commencement and completion of work. Log Book and Attendance Register shall be maintained and signed daily by the supervisor and countersigned by the EIC monthly.
- 5.9 Some of the works that are urgent and require timely completion shall be intimated verbally as well as through email. All communication through Email mentioning duration of the particular work shall be acknowledged through Email within 48hrs otherwise the duration mentioned by EIC, shall be considered final. Any change in the time of completion must be sought by written request (or through email) stating proper reason by the contractor well in advance. Failure in adhering the schedule of work completion shall attract penalty under penalty clause.
- 5.10 The Contractor has to submit the condition monitoring report of the MS Structures/ Equipment in various plant with respect to the damage and potential risks involved along with schedule to carry out the repair and maintenance works based on priority in consultation with the EIC.
- 5.11 All the works as mentioned in the scope of work are not in continuous nature as it depends on so many factors like releasing of the Equipment, some of which may be possible on maintenance days only, climatic conditions, etc., which the contractor have to consider. Also dismantling, fabrication and Painting of structural are to be carried out based on the need basis from production department and availability of equipment.
- 5.12 All the stated works are to be carried out while the plant is in operation and it may take some time for isolation of the equipment or pipeline before taking over for repair/maintenance.

6.0 EXPERIENCE:

- 6.1 Supervisor- Degree (Mechanical) with min. 1 year experience/ Diploma (Mechanical) with min. 3 years experience in mechanical maintenance of chemical industries.
- 6.2 FRP liner- Person with minimum 5 year experience in FRP Lining Works in chemical industry.
- 6.3 Painter- Person with minimum 5 year experience in Painting of equipment and Civil structures works in chemical industry.
- 6.4 Welder/Fabricator- ITI Passed (Welder/Fabricator/Fitter/Sheet Metal Trade) with min. 2 year experience OR person with 5 year experience in arc welding, gas welding and gas cutting works connected with fabrication / mechanical maintenance works of any industry with multi craft skill like fitting, welding, gas cutting and rigging.
- 6.5 Fitter/Rigger- ITI Passed (Fitter/Rigger Trade) with min. 2 year exp. in mechanical maintenance of any industries with multi craft skills OR person with minimum 5 years' experience in fabrication / mechanical maintenance works of any industry with multi craft skill like fitting, welding, gas cutting and rigging.

7.0 SAFETY, SUPERVISION & HOUSEKEEPING:

7.1 The contractor is fully responsible for carrying out the work in a safe manner. Successful contractor has to carry out the work with utmost care and as per the rules laid down by IREL

safety department. Safety permit for working at heights and hazardous areas must be obtained on daily basis prior to starting of the work. Every effort must be taken to ensure that normal production should not be affected due to repair and maintenance works carried out by the contractor.

- 7.2 The work must be carried out under close supervision and without causing any damage/hindrance to the existing structure or equipment and other activities in the surrounding areas.
- 7.3 The work spot shall be cleared of the waste materials / debris on daily basis. On completion of the work all working implements, scaffoldings, excess materials, etc., if any must be removed from site immediately.
- 7.4 Proper covering should be provided to prevent any foreign impurities from contaminating other tanks/products e.g. by covering the nearby tank/equipment by tarpaulin or any other arrangement.
- 7.5 The contractor has to ensure proper ventilation and illumination on tanks/equipment before starting the allocated works in plants.
- 7.6 The Contractor must provide Personal Protective Equipment for their workmen suitable for the working environment and also as per the advice of the Safety-in-charge/Engineer-in-charge. All tools & tackles and working implements such as ladders, welding machines, gas cutting machines, drilling machines, angle grinder, welding mirrors, extension boards, scaffolding materials, etc. shall be shown to safety department for competent person approval before executing the work. The list of tools & tackles and working implements approved by safety Department shall be submitted to the EIC.
- 7.7 The scaffolding used for height work shall be of Mild steel tubular type with base plate, boards and necessary bracings and working platform must be provided with hand rails. Materials used must be of good quality and strength. Safety net shall be provided wherever the work is carried out at height of more than 3 metres. Also, safety net shall be provided below the working platform of the scaffolding while work is being carried out at height. Double lanyard safety belt shall be used while working at height and the hook shall be clamped at different locations on the lifeline/rigid structures.
- 7.8 Electrical extension boards are to be fitted with safety devices like ELCB, MCB, Fuse units, etc. Each power tool shall be supplied through individual plug sockets. Electrical power shall be tapped through ISI marked industrial socket. Flexible cable used shall be of FRLS type with adequate current carrying capacity for the loads to be connected. Poor insulated cables and too many joints on the cable shall be avoided.
- 7.9 Flash back arrestors shall be provided in both the torch side and the cylinder side of all gas cutting equipment. Gas cylinders used for cutting and welding operations shall be mounted on the trolley.

8.0 CONTRACTOR'S SCOPE OF SUPPLY:

- 8.1 The contractor has to supply the resins and mats as per the Clause 1.4 and Clause 1.7. Tax Invoice copy for the same is to be submitted to the EIC. Working implements, scaffoldings, blowers or exhaust fans for ventilation, provision for illumination, etc. must be under contractor's scope of supply. Inspection of the materials should be done at the entry of the IREL. All the materials required to carry out the work shall be verified by the EIC and after inspection by the EIC will be permitted inside IREL premises.
- 8.2 The Contractor has to supply minimum 18mm thick Wooden Chequered Board for the repair/fabrication of Platform structures and Process Vessels/Tanks and other equipment. Epoxy Chemical Corrosion resistance primer, finish paints and thinner are to be supplied by the Contractor. For naming of the tanks/equipment Yellow and Black Enamel paint shall also be brought by the contractor. All tools and accessories required for cleaning, surface preparation

and painting of tanks and equipment like cup brush attached with angle grinder, wire brushes, scrapers, emery papers/tapes, chisel, painting brush, ladders, exhaust fans (for ventilation), etc. are to be brought by the contractor.

- 8.3 The contractor must bring materials like metallic scaffoldings (if required), ladders, cotton wastes, Electrical Extension Board, Welding consumables like welding rod (for SS,CS & MS), welding shield etc., gas cutting set, cutting torch, welding machine, drilling machine, riveting machine, anchor bolts, rivets, HDPE welding mirrors, surface preparation tools, painting brushes, scrapers and required labor etc. for the work.
- The contractor must bring all MS Fasteners (Nuts, Bolts, Washers, etc.) required for carrying out all the works mentioned as per Scope of Work and Details of Works.
- 8.5 All Safety Equipment and Personnel Protective Equipment depending on the type of Work shall be covered under contractor's scope of supply.

9.0 IREL SCOPE OF SUPPLY:

IREL will provide HDPE & MS pipes and fittings, Structural Steel, gaskets, Titanium/ Metal Putty and MS & FRP Handrails. In addition to that Electricity and Water at single point shall be provided by the IREL for which the contractor has to make his own arrangements for using the same following the safety regulations practiced by IREL.

10.0 SITE INSPECTION:

Interested bidders are advised to inspect the site on any working days at our specified visiting hours with the permission of the Engineer concerned/Purchase Dept to study the nature of work, labour supply/availability, trade union practices and labour rates prevailing at Udyogamandal.

11.0 PENALTY CLAUSE:

- 11.1 The Party has to depute required no. of workers and supervisor mentioned in the clause 5.1 failing which will attract penalty of ₹2,000 per person per day for workers and ₹3500 per day for supervisor.
- Party has to ensure the timely completion of the work, if the delay is found attributable to the contractor, penalty of ₹2,000 per day will be levied upon the contractor.
- 11.3 The contractor has to ensure good workmanship of the work executed, if any abnormalities/deviation noticed in the attended work, the contractor is liable to attract penalty of ₹2000 per work.

12.0 PAYMENT TERMS:

- Payment will be made on monthly basis for the actual quantity of work completed. 90 % value of the actual quantity of completed work less statutory deductions applicable shall be released.
- 12.2 10% of the bill amount (including 5% retention money collected from each interim/part bill, if any) will be retained by IREL as retention deposit/money against the performance of guarantee.
- 12.3 The Retention Money will be paid after the guarantee period or on submission of a bank guarantee for an equivalent amount valid till the completion of guarantee period.
- 12.4 Final measurement shall be taken within one month after completion of the entire work and the final bill shall be submitted within 40 days of completion of the entire work in all respects.
- 12.5 The contractor is responsible and liable to remit all statutory dues (GST, etc.) collected/included in the Price Schedule of the contract, to the Statutory Authorities without fail. IREL is not responsible for remittance of such tax collections.

12.6 In case the work order requires any amendment, the contractor will be paid 90% of the final bill amount less statutory deductions as ad-hoc payment. However, any quantity variation beyond 10% of the order quantity will not be considered for the purpose of ad-hoc payment. Final settlement will be done after issuing the order amendment. The recommendation for ad-hoc payment will be at the sole discretion of the Engineer-in-charge (EIC).

13.0 VARIATION OF QUANTITY:

Quantities stated are approximate. The contractor must be willing to accept any variation in individual item quantities and the unit quoted rates shall remain unchanged. The company reserves the right to cancel any part of the work if the same is not required at the time of implementation of the work. The contractor has to quote as per Price Schedule/BOQ.

14.0 PERIOD OF CONTRACT:

- 14.1 The period of contract shall be one year from the date of receipt of work order.
- 14.2 15 days from the date of dispatch/ posting of work order/ letter by IREL will be considered for the receipt of work order unless proven otherwise by the contractor.

15.0 ENGINEER-IN-CHARGE (EIC):

Shri. Anurag Pandey, DM-Technical (Mechanical Maintenance) will be the Engineer-in-charge for this work.

PRE-CONTRACT INTEGRITY PACT

General

WHEREAS the BUYER proposes to procure (Name of the Stores / Equipment / Item) and the BIDDER/Seller is will to offer / has offered the stores and

WHEREAS the BIDDER is a private company / public company / Government undertaking / partnership / registered export agency, constituted in accordance with the relevant law in the matter and the BUYER is a PSU.

NOW, THEREFORE,

To avoid all forms of corruption by following a system that is fair, transparent and free from any influence / prejudiced dealings prior to, during and subsequent to the currency of the contract to be entered into with a view to:-

Enabling the BUYER to obtain the desired said stores/equipment at a competitive price in conformity with the defined specifications by avoiding the high cost and the distortionary Impact of corruption on public procurement, and

Enabling BIDDERS to abstain from bribing or indulging in any corrupt practice in order to secure the contract by providing assurance to them that their competitors will also abstain from bribing and other corrupt practices and the BUYER will commit to prevent corruption, in any form, by its officials by following transparent procedures.

The parties hereto hereby agree to enter into this Integrity Pact and agree as follows: Commitments of the BUYER

- 5.3 In case of the successful BIDDER a clause would also be incorporated in the Article pertaining to Performance Bond in the Purchase Contract that the provisions of Sanctions for Violation shall be applicable for forfeiture of Performance Bond in case of a decision by the BUYER to forfeit the same without assigning any reason for imposing sanction for violation of this Pact.

6.0 Sanctions for Violations

11.0 Validity

SAFE USE OF VEHICLES:

It will be entirely the responsibility of the Contractor to ensure that the vehicles are notdriven with so high speed or in so reckless or rash manner as to cause accident or prove to be potential threat to the safety of the traffic. Where the speed limits have been fixed, they will be strictly adhered to by the Contractor's drivers who will also adhere to slow and safe driving inside the Plant and Township Area. Failure to comply with the above may result in termination of the contract.

Suitable safety precautions must be taken by the Contractor for his vehicular traffic at the level crossing/roads inside the Plant/ Township area. Contractors would be using those roads on their own risk and responsibility without any liability on the part of IREL Management.
